Dear Parents/Carers,

#### **Car Park and Parking**

Thank you to the parents/carers for ensuring the new car park/drop-off zone has been successful. It really has made a massive difference to our school. There are still a very few parents/carers who continue to park on **yellow lines** or drive the **wrong way around the new car park**, so can I please ask you to all abide by the school's rules and Traffic Management Policy.

# **Premises**

Over the past two weeks I have held in depth discussions with the local authority regarding the state of our playing field, as well as the fencing and drop near the staff car park. The local authority has agreed to put better fencing up to prevent children climbing and potentially falling from the gabion walls. This is an urgent matter, and I ask you all to keep a very close eye on your children whilst lining up at the start of the school day.

The local authority have also agreed to invest in the field and make good what is an awful situation. In addition to that, I met the <a href="Cymru Football Foundation">Cymru Football Foundation</a> (CFF) to discuss options for a 45m x 45m 3G facility adjacent to the car park. This is a very new idea, and discussions are at the very early stages. A lot will all depend on 'need' from the community. So, if you are involved with a football or rugby club, or any other sports club that require access to a 3G and can't get on at Neath Sports Centre or Llandarcy Academy of Sport, let me know.

#### **Special Cruyff Court**

I have recently obtained around £60,000 in funding from the <u>Cruyff Foundation</u> to create a 'Special Cruyff Court on foundation yard. Where the children currently play is unacceptable in my eyes and I am trying to get funding to match fund what the Cruyff Foundation have pledged. If any of you know businesses who will be keen to sponsor and support this application, please do let me know. We are talking of fundraising around £100,000, with a grant from the CFF to help support us.

The local authority has no money to contribute, so we will need to raise a lot of money ourselves and/or through grants.



Ben Davies, the Wales and Tottenham Hotspur defender, has agreed in principle to have the Special Cruyff Court named after him.

As a Neath boy, and a player I coached at Swansea City, Ben has kindly agreed to support the school as much as possible.

Below is a picture of a Cruyff Court. The impact for this could be huge for our school and the local community, so please do share with businesses to see if they are keen to sponsor or donate (any amount is gratefully received). Our Cruyff Court would not be this big, but it would still be a great addition to our school.
